JOHN TERRY

One of the most decorated defenders in English football history, John Terry is still worshipped by fans at Stamford Bridge where he spent almost his entire career, winning countless trophies and being a bedrock of the resurgent Blues team. From his debut at just 18 years of age, it was clear he was destined for Chelsea greatness, going on to make an incredible 717 appearances for the club 1998 to 2017, scoring an impressive 67 goals, more than any other Chelsea defender. A commanding presence known for his bravery, aerial dominance, and leadership, he captained Chelsea for over a decade, leading the club through its most successful era. John won five Premier League titles, five FA Cups, three League Cups, one UEFA Champions League (2012), and one UEFA Europa League (2013). He was named in the PFA Team of the Year five times and won the PFA Players' Player of the Year in 2005. John also earned 78 caps for England, serving as captain for several years, featuring in multiple Euro and World Cup tournaments. His fierce loyalty, defensive prowess, and winning mentality made him a cornerstone of Chelsea's modern success and a true Premier League icon.



TONY ADAMS

Tony is an undisputed Arsenal legend and one of the greatest defenders in English football history. He spent his entire 19-year playing career at Arsenal, making 672 appearances between 1983 and 2002, weighing in with an impressive 49 goals, including many trademark thumping headers! Known for his leadership, grit, and tactical intelligence, he captained the Gunners for 14 years, leading them to four league titles, including two doubles in 1997-98 and 2001-02, and the legendary "Invincibles" undefeated league title triumph of 2003-2004. Tony won three FA Cups, two League Cups, and a European Cup Winners' Cup with Arsenal, winning many individual accolades along the way. He earned 66 caps for England, featuring in four major international tournaments, including the run to the semi-finals of Euro 96. Off the pitch, he famously battled and overcame alcoholism, later founding the Sporting Chance clinic to help other athletes. He remains a symbol of loyalty and resilience, embodying the spirit of Arsenal Football Club. Nicknamed "Mr. Arsenal," Tony Adams was inducted into the Premier League Hall of Fame in 2023.

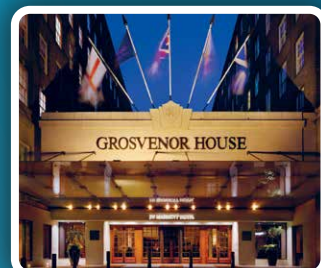
PETE GRAVES
